

REGULAR SESSION

May 8, 2018

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of McMinnville, Tennessee, met in regular session at its regular meeting place, City Hall, Tuesday, May 8, 2018, at approximately 7:00 p.m. Adequate public notice of the agenda was given by notices posted at City Hall, articles in the Southern Standard newspaper and news reports on the local radio stations. Present were: Vice Mayor Ben Newman, Aldermen, Kate Alsbrook, Everett Brock, Ryle Chastain, Steve Harvey, and Mike Neal. Absent: Mayor Jimmy Haley. Others present: Shirley Durham, City Recorder; Tim Pirtle, City Attorney; and members of the news media and press. Bill Brock, City Administrator, was absent.

The meeting was presided over by the Honorable Vice Mayor Ben Newman, with Shirley Durham, recording the action taken at the meeting.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES

Vice Mayor Newman stated that written copies of the minutes of the regular session of April 24, 2018 had been sent to each member of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen previously. He asked if any member of the Board wished to make any corrections, additions or modifications to the minutes.

Motion was made by Mr. Chastain to dispense with the reading of the minutes and approve them as written. The motion was seconded by Mr. Neal and carried.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS

Vice Mayor Newman recognized Patti Rossen, 108 Greenhill Road, Smithville, TN who complained about the music that is played at Gilley Pool. She felt that some of the music was inappropriate for children and youth. She stated it was also too loud. She recommended they have no music at all.

Mr. Hennessee reported all of the street paving for this fiscal year has been completed. They recently paved Garfield Street, Post Road and Edgewood Avenue.

Vice Mayor Newman read a Proclamation to recognize National Police Week 2018 and to honor the service and sacrifice of those law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty while protecting our communities and safeguarding our democracy.

Mayor Haley formally designated May 13-19, 2018, as Police Week in the City of McMinnville, Tennessee, and publicly salute the service of law enforcement officers in our community and in communities across the nation.

Vice Mayor Newman read a Proclamation where Mayor Haley proclaimed May 2018 as Building Safety Month across the City of McMinnville.

Vice Mayor Newman read a press release from Senator Bowling and Mayor Haley announcing state funding for McMinnville Driver License Center.

Vice Mayor Newman reminded everyone the Musky Tournament is this weekend and the Elected Officials Day at Habitat is also Saturday.

Due to the weather Ride the Strip has been rescheduled for Saturday.
